PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE

September 16, 2020 Policy

It is the policy of Strike to maintain all tools, vehicles and equipment in a condition that will maximize the safety of all personnel. An inventory of STRIKE's machinery/ equipment is established and maintained. When new machinery or equipment is acquired, it must be added to the inventory.

Guidelines

The President is to ensure that a Preventative Maintenance Program is developed, implemented, maintained and shall include the following components:

- Adherence to applicable regulations, standards and manufacturers' specifications.
- Services of appropriately qualified maintenance personnel.
- Scheduling and documentation of all maintenance work.
- Defects observed in machinery or equipment shall be reported to a supervisor and must be repaired or replaced before being used again.
- Inventory of all vehicles and equipment will be maintained.
- Vehicles and equipment will be maintained as per manufacturer's and legislative specifications and/or as required by Strike; this will include site specific needs.

Supervisors are responsible for the application of the program in his/her area of responsibility
