TRAINING

- Knives are not to be used for certain tasks (e.g., cutting zip ties, stripping wire). Instead, use side cutters, snips, wire strippers, etc.
- Select and use the knife most appropriate for your task. For example, retractable-style knives should only be used for light duty tasks (e.g., cutting cardboard, shipping materials).

GENERAL DO'S AND DON'TS

THE DO's:

- **DO** Follow customer and/or site rules/policy for knife use (some sites may ban certain or all knives).
- **DO** Choose the appropriate cutting tool for the job.
- **DO** Inspect the knife to ensure it is sharp, and not damaged or defective.
- **DO** Keep all body parts and coworkers out of the knife's line of fire/path of travel.
- **DO** Wear cut-resistant gloves whenever using knives or handling material with sharp edges.
- **DO** Use a device other than your hand to hold the object being cut, wherever possible.
- DO Secure work with clamps/devices or brace material against a workbench, table, etc.
- **DO** Maintain your balance and proper footing at all times to better control the knife.
- **DO** Keep knives clean and free from dirt, oil and other contaminants that can hinder grip.
- **DO** Store knives with the blade retracted or covered/protected in scabbard.
- **DO** Use tool lanyards if working at heights with workers below.

THE DON'Ts:

DON'T Cut toward yourself or a co-worker.

DON'T Use excessive force on the knife to make the cut.

DON'T Use worn, cracked, or bent knives. Replace them immediately to avoid injury.

DON'T Put hands or body in the line of fire.

DON'T Throw or toss knives. Hand them, handle first, directly to other workers while giving verbal warning.

DON'T Try to catch a dropped knife.

DON'T Talk to others with a knife in your hand as we tend to talk with our hands.

DON'T Expect a regular work glove to protect you; use a cut-resistant glove when cutting.

PROPER USE OF KNIVES (Line of Fire and PPE)













SCRAPER USE

THE DO's:

- **DO** Follow customer and/or site rules/policy for knife use (some sites may ban certain or all knives).
- **DO** Choose the appropriate scraper tool for the job.
- **DO** Inspect the scraper to ensure it is sharp, and not damaged or defective.
- **DO** Keep all body parts and coworkers out of the line of fire/path of travel of the scraper.
- **DO** Wear cut-resistant gloves whenever using knives or handling material with sharp edges.
- **DO** Use both Hands to hold the scraper.
- **DO** Use smooth steady strokes keeping the blade on the pipe.
- **DO** Maintain your balance and proper footing at all times to better control the scraper.
- **DO** Keep scrapers clean and free from dirt, oil and other contaminants that can hinder grip.
- **DO** Store scrapers with the blade covered/protected using the plastic cover from manufacture whenever possible.
- **DO** Use tool lanyards if working at heights with workers below.

THE DON'Ts:

- **DON'T** Use scraper with blade facing towards yourself or a co-worker.
- **DON'T** Use excessive force on the scraper blade causing the blade to break.
- **DON'T** Use worn, cracked, or bent blades. Replace them immediately to avoid injury.
- **DON'T** Put hands or body in line of fire.
- **DON'T** Throw or toss scrapers. Hand them, handle first, directly to other workers giving verbal warning.
- **DON'T** Try to catch a dropped scraper.
- **DON'T** Talk to others with a scraper in your hand as we tend to talk with our hands.
- **DON'T** Expect a regular work glove to protect you; use a cut-resistant glove when using scrapers.

CHANGING A SCRAPER BLADE

THE DO's:

DO Utilise a clamp, vice, or other device to secure a scraper when changing the blades whenever possible.

DO Have the scraper placed on a flat surface to change the blade.

DO Have proper sized screwdriver for the screw head size.

DO Have the plastic blade cover on the blade if possible.

DO Have one hand on the scraper handle and on hand on the screwdriver.

THE DON'Ts

DON'T Hold onto the scraper while changing blades. This will increase the chance of slipping and potentially cutting yourself.

DON'T Use other tools to remove the screws securing the blade. Only use the proper sized screwdriver.

DON'T Expect a regular work glove to protect you; use a cut-resistant glove when cutting
